# Our ambitions, and progress

The Theatre Chipping Norton is a rural arts hub whose aims are

- to make and host inspiring performances that will transform lives in Oxfordshire and beyond.
- to make the benefits of the arts accessible to all, providing the support our community needs, and a place to belong for everyone.

In times of significant change, both across the world and in our own communities, theatres provide crucial benefits, which include:

- a sense of escapism, a time to switch off from daily life and any challenges.
- relatability, using live performances and cinema to better help us to understand our own challenges and relationships.
- connection and shared experience. With half<sup>1</sup> of the UK population describing themselves as lonely, connecting with performers and others sharing the performance experience provides a range of mental health benefits.

- inclusivity, building empathy and understanding by helping us to step into others shoes and experience culture alongside other members of our community; and
- making memories. From our annual panto to life-changing activities and workshops.

## Making this accessible

In 2024-25 we worked to maintain affordable prices so that as many people in Chipping Norton and beyond could access our performances.

Over 40,000 people enjoyed 209 live performances on our stage, including 868 free community and carer tickets.

We also built on our focused community programme that ensures we are reaching, and engaging those in our community who have the most to gain from the arts, yet are the least likely to be able to access them.

Providing over 2,000 free or subsidised sessions for young people in our local rural community

This year we funded 79% of our programme of productions through tickets sales (an impressive achievement for a rural venue of 220 seats) and our community programme is supported entirely by donations. However, ensuring The Theatre remains accessible requires support from our supporters and funders. In 2024-25 we raised £461,400, which included a grant of £95,000 to replace our outdated stage lighting with a new energy efficient LED rig.



In 2025-26 our ambition is to continue making and sharing inspiring live performances and creative activities, be a driver of social change and community cohesion, and a source of joy for our audiences.

# 50 years of creativity in Chipping Norton

# Delivering a rich programme and community benefits in a changing funding landscape

In 1968 by Tamara & John Malcolm asked every Chipping Norton resident to donate £1 to create a theatre for the town in the Former Salvation Army Citadel. Materials, skills and labour were also donated and the first panto's were fundraisers held at the Town Hall before The Theatre was open. Goddard's Lane cottage was bought and converted to create the daytime box office, dressing rooms, rehearsal room, costume store, offices and green room.

Take Part and our first Youth Theatre was born.

## THE THEATRE OPENS

The adjacent cottage was converted into the bar, toilets and dressing rooms and The Theatre was officially opened by Tom Baker (who was playing Dr Who) in 1975.



#### MAJOR REFURBISHMENT

Funded partly by the Arts Council we improved the building, stage and wing space. Graham Rust, one of Europe's finest muralists, painted our murals.

#### Did You Know?

The Theatre generally retains only 20-25% of the box office income for live performances, returning the remainder to the Visiting Artists.

The Theatre closed in lockdown.

Our community rallied and helped us weather the storm. We began making lunches and free art activities for local families who were struggling - our community programme was born.

Afresco events became the order of the day. Panto was impossible but a one man production of Christmas Carol with David Bradbury marked an inspired return to the stage. This year 79% of The Theatre's income came from tickets, hires and sales, with the remainder raised by fundraising. In addition, all our community work is funded by grants & donations.

Panto, and our inhouse productions make an increasingly important contribution, as do Friends, Patrons, sponsors and fundraising.

#### CORE ARTS COUNCIL FUNDING CUT

In 2008 Arts Council cut its £40,000 annual grant to The Theatre, half our public funding, in changes which hit over 200 arts organisations in England.



### THEATRE MAKERS

Under John Terry's leadership we began producing more of our own 'homegrown' productions and taking some on tour. Theatre tax relief, introduced in 2014, was and still is, pivotal in making theatrical productions viable in the UK.



## BACK TO BREAK EVEN!

Audiences were cautious to return which, added to rising costs, led to some challenging years after COVID.

In 2023-24, we achieved break even for the first time since the pandemic. We were also gaining recognition for our community work: WODC supported our outreach projects, although they no longer fund The Theatre itself. Funding models for all theatres are increasingly locally, not nationally, led.

# Producing and sharing creative arts

Our theatre is known for Panto, but we are also a hub for a wide range of creativity. In 2024/25 this included

LIVE THEATRE - producing 5 in-house shows, and welcoming touring companies for 93 performances.

COMEDY - hosting 20 comedians from Rosie Holt to Frank Skinner

MUSIC - 14 live performances from Queen to the Budapest Café Orchestra.

SCREENINGS we showed 42 performances from houses in the UK and the US

FILM - from Oscar nominees to family favourites - sometimes with wine too!

DANCE - performances and events from Ballet Central to our Silent Discos!

ART - our gallery hosted four exhibitions

Our ambitious productions of Lark Rise and Barn Dance transformed the auditorium into an Oxfordshire barn, blending local, community actors with professional cast and crew to create two of our most ambitious productions to date.

# Accessible productions

Everyone is always welcome at The Theatre, and so we consider as many ways as possible to help, including

- Relaxed performances and screenings.
- A dedicated break out space during relaxed performances.
- · Subtitled films.
- Captioned and audio described live performances.
- · An integrated hearing loop system.
- Free community and companion tickets we gave 866 tickets in 24-25

Bloxham Grove Academy (a local school for young people with additional needs) attended a Relaxed Panto Performance as a whole school in 2024.

# Supporting the Chipping Norton Community

We believe that creativity and expression is for everyone.

We created our Take Part programme with a specific aim of inclusivity for all. This includes weekly participatory classes for 280 children, young people, adults, and those with additional needs in addition to 196 school holiday workshop participants.

# Supporting the Chipping Norton Community

We run a range of arts-based opportunities to help the most vulnerable young people across our rural community to foster confidence, self-worth, resilience, and adaptability; vital skills for today, and for the future.

This year we have been able to support more families with additional needs by adding specialist youth theatre groups, more drama based mental health support in local schools and creative support groups for their parents.

## Youth Theatre SEN & Youth Theatre Open Senior

A much-needed and asked-for provision for young people with higher needs who are often unable to access drama and after school activities. Our experienced practitioners provide these great young people with crucial development opportunities and a home at the Theatre where they feel welcomed as they are.

"I love acting and theatre is helping me improve so much. You get transported into a different world and you are put into the character's shoes. I've been part of the theatre for a while now and every time it feels like a whole new adventure."

# Supporting Young People's Mental Health

Our Mental Health Groups and Workshops have been responding to a high level of need in our local schools.

Our drama-based mental heath programmes in schools are especially important for young people who are struggling with mental health, anxiety and the impact of adverse childhood experiences. We have expanded our work at Chipping Norton School to support years 7, 8, 11 and SEN children with high anxiety, and begun a new partnership with Park School (our local special educational mental health school) supporting young people who cannot access mainstream education.

52 Young people participated in termly drama and well being courses in school.
